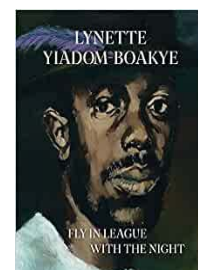
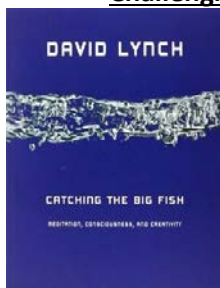
Art/Work, by Jonathan Melber, Heather Darcy Bhandari: This book digs into the day-to-day aspects of what you need to know for running your art business.
